New Walkovers in St. Augustine Beach

The City of St. Augustine Beach in partnership with the St. Augustine Port Waterway and Beach District recently completed a Dunes Walkover project. The project kicked off in October of 2022 with walkovers on 3rd Street, 4th Street, 5th Street and 8th Street. The 3rd Street and 5th Street locations are ramp style walkovers and 4th and 8th Street have stair access.

SEPAC Volunteers Needed: Make a Difference in our City!

SEPAC is a committee made up of a group of volunteers. The Committee undertakes beautification projects in the City, examines environmental issues, and advises the City Commission on issues of note.

The Committee meets once a month, though various projects may require additional volunteer time. While no specific expertise is necessary, the Committee is in need of members with knowledge of and interest in native plants, landscape design, sea-level rise, and more. Native Plant of the Month: Firebush

While its beauty is what initially led SEPAC to select the firebush for its wildflower meadow, we love several other aspects of the plant as well. It attracts birds and butterflies, blooms for months, and is easy to maintain.

The firebush (Hamelia patens) is a shrub with red flowers that bloom from spring through the first freeze. It loves its home in St. Augustine Beach, as it enjoys full sun (but can also tolerate partial shade) and doesn't mind salt spray.



American Flag Rescue Program

The American Flag Rescue (AFR) program was initiated in 2019 after St. Johns County Solid Waste Management staff observed worn and damaged Americans flags in drop-off garbage containers at the Tillman Ridge facility. Although some flag collection containers already were in place in several stores that sell American flags, more collection points were clearly needed. The initial shipment of new flag collection boxes was funded by local radio personality Kevin Geddings. These units were placed in St. Johns County libraries. Of the nearly 1,000 flags collected in 2020, about 10% were reusable and these are available to the public. Damaged flags are retired according to established protocols by local Scout troops and veteran's organizations. An American Flag booklet provided by Supervisor of Elections Vicky Oakes is also available. 





