St. Johns County encourages its residents to sign up for emergency notifications at www.alertstjohns.com. Alert St. Johns enables St. Johns County to provide residents with critical information in a variety of emergency situations, such as severe weather, unexpected road closures, water advisories, missing persons, evacuations of buildings or neighborhoods, and incidents that may pose a threat to public safety. By signing up, residents can choose to receive time-sensitive messages via phone call, text message, or email.



Hurricane Ian and Nicole FEMA Dune Enhancement Project



The Butler Beach Reach project is scheduled to begin mobilizing to the beach on July 6th and construction activity on the beach beginning July 10th. SJC has selected the contractor Phillips and Jordan to construct this project.

The Butler Beach Reach is the shoreline from Ocean Hammock Park through Bryn Mawr Ocean Resort, in addition to a 1,500 ft section from Mary Street going south.

What Residents Can Expect Along the Way

Construction Vehicle Access: Sand will be trucked in from upland mines to the beach access points throughout the project area. The sand will then be trucked along the beach to the placement area.

Intermittent Beach Closures: Sections of the beach with active construction will be closed off to the public. The constructed dunes will be planted with sea oats to increase dune resiliency.

On-Beach Driving: Access will be temporarily affected by the project. Expect Ocean Trace Road, Dondanville Road, and Mary Street to close at some point during the project. Beach driving from A Street will also be affected.

Thursday 7/6

1. Full closure of Ocean Trace Rd. The Contractor will begin to move heavy equipment to the Ocean Trace access.

2. A St to remain open with vehicles exiting off at Dondanville. Sunday 7/9

1. A St to hard close at its normal 5PM Monday 7/10

1. Contractor begin sand hauling from Ocean Trace rd with A St and OTR officially both closed to vehicles.

Sea Turtle Nesting Season - Important Information!

Saint Johns County had a record - breaking nesting season last year with 1,235 nests

LIGHTS OUT!

SEA TURTLE NESTING SEASON **IS HERE**

Nesting activities occur on St. Johns County's 41 miles of beach between May 1-October 31 every year. Nesting activities include females entering the beach to lay eggs or hatchlings emerging from their nest. In 2022, Saint John's County Beaches had a record year of nesting - 1,235 nests compared to 822 in 2021. Residents and visitors have the honor of sharing their home with such an amazing species, and it is our duty to protect these vulnerable animals. If you have the luck to witness either of these activities, please make sure to watch from a distance, do not use any flashlights and do touch the animals.

- Fill in holes and knock down sand castles that may obstruct sea turtles' path. - Do not leave toys, trash, tents, or beach furniture on the beach overnight.

The **Florida softshell turtle** (*Apalone ferox*) is a species of turtle in the familyTrionychidae. The species is native to the Southeastern United States.

This species of turtle is mainly a Florida Turtle covering most of FL and into Southern Georgia

We know it was a female based on the size, where the females are much larger than the males.

For this save, it is important to note we still have a diverse variety of native Florida species still habituating St Aug Beach, in addition to white tail deer in Ocean Hammock Park, that make their way from Marsh Creek to the Beach.

So drivers need to be aware when driving on the roads and maintain the speed limits.

During the rescue, there were also other individuals to assist with the traffic. This is very important, when attempting to save wildlife in a highway, it is dangerous.

They were fortunate to be near a traffic light and to have others flag traffic as she was picked up and moved to the pond behind city hall.



American Flag Rescue Program

The American Flag Rescue (AFR) program was initiated in 2019 after St. Johns County Solid Waste Management staff observed worn and damaged Americans flags in drop-off garbage containers at the Tillman Ridge facility. Although some flag collection containers already were in place in several stores that sell American flags, more collection points were clearly needed. The initial shipment of new flag collection boxes was funded by local radio personality Kevin Geddings. These units were placed in St. Johns County libraries. Of the nearly 1,000 flags collected in 2020, about 10% were reusable and these are available to the public. Damaged flags are retired according to established protocols by local Scout troops and veteran's organizations. An American Flag booklet provided by Supervisor of Elections Vicky Oakes is also available. 
