Community Memorial Ben LaMendola

On October 26, community members gathered at the St. Johns County Pier Pavilion in St. Augustine Beach to honor the lifelong contributions of Ben LaMendola (1939-2022), who was memorialized with a plaque at the pavilion he took the lead in building.

Some of Ben LaMendola's family members—including his widow, Dee, his daughter Kim, his 17-year-old granddaughter Savannah, and his nephew Ronald Casacchia—were present for the ceremony. St. Johns County District 5 Commissioner Henry Dean and St. Johns County Parks and Recreation Director Ryan Kane spoke about Ben LaMendola's work to improve St. Augustine Beach, St. Augustine, and the County as a whole.

Ben's life was proof that "people with a passion for the community can do great things for future generations to enjoy," Kane said.

"He did a lot for the County, from helping to bring us the Nights of Lights in St. Augustine to planning the beach festivals that were such a staple

of our community," Dean said.

Savannah LaMendola remembered her grandfather as "a very humble man," always thinking of his neighbors. Dee LaMendola recalled how eager and determined her husband was to make the pavilion a reality once he thought of it.

SEPAC Unveils Eco Garden on A1A Beach

When driving on A1A Beach, you may have noticed some new landscaping between 7th and 8th Streets. SEPAC recently created the City's first eco garden! The garden includes a swale filled with many natives plants and flowers and a bordering section of the City's signature white fencing. SEPAC created the eco garden to reduce stormwater runoff and flooding and to filter pollutants from getting into our water system. The eco garden is also a great habitat for butterflies and birds. Be sure to check out the Blanket Flower, Dune Daisy, Seaside Goldenrod, Muhly and Fakahatchee Grasses,

and more to get ideas on how to create an eco garden in your own yard or neighborhood!

Recycling Update – Where to Drop off your Glass for Recycling

BEACH RESTORATION PROJECT



Update for FCCE re-nourishment of St. Augustine Beach

The project will begin in February of 2024 with an estimated completion date of September 2024.

USACE Jacksonville District, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, awarded a \$33.5 million contract Sept. 29 to Great Lakes Dredge & Dock Co., LLC, of Houston, Texas, to execute a Flood Control and Coastal Emergencies (FCCE) renourishment of the St. Augustine Beach federal shore protection project. The project will place approximately 2.5 million cubic yards of sand on critically eroded beaches within the city of St. Augustine Beach extending three miles from Anastasia State Park at the north to the vicinity of A St. at the southern end of the shoreline.

The main staging area for the project will be located at Pope Road with additional beach access at A St. Sand will be dredged from a Bureau of Ocean Energy Management approved offshore borrow located 6 nautical miles offshore. The estimated start and finish dates of construction and details of the project

timeline and placement sequence will be determined after coordination with Great Lakes and published via USACE and St. Johns County social media channels. St. Johns County in the non-federal sponsor for the St. Augustine Beach shore protection project; the FCCE re-nourishment will be 100 percent federally funded to restore damages from recent hurricanes and nor'easter events. USACE Jacksonville appreciates our strong partnership with St. Johns County and their support for this effort and many other shore protection projects within the

county.

St. Johns County encourages its residents to sign up for emergency notifications at www.alertstjohns.com. Alert St. Johns enables St. Johns County to provide residents with critical information in a variety of emergency situations, such as severe weather, unexpected road closures, water advisories, missing persons, evacuations of buildings or neighborhoods, and incidents that may pose a threat to public safety. By signing up, residents can choose to receive time-sensitive messages via phone call, text message, or email.



American Flag Rescue Program

The American Flag Rescue (AFR) program was initiated in 2019 after St.

Johns County Solid Waste Management staff observed worn and damaged Americans flags in drop-off garbage containers at the Tillman Ridge facility. Although some flag collection containers already were in place in several stores that sell American flags, more collection points were clearly needed. The initial shipment of new flag collection boxes was funded by local radio personality Kevin Geddings. These units were placed in St. Johns County libraries. Of the nearly 1,000 flags collected in 2020, about 10% were reusable and these are available to the public. Damaged flags are retired according to established protocols by local Scout troops and veteran's organizations. An American Flag booklet provided by Supervisor of Elections Vicky Oakes is also available. 
