



FCCE re-nourishment of St. Augustine Beach

On February 23, 2024 USACE Jacksonville began equipment mobilization for the re-nourishment of the St. Johns County, St. Augustine Beach, federal shore protection project.

The USACE contractor began establishing a staging area at the Pope Road access point and will continue deploying equipment in the week ahead. Beach placement of dredged sand is expected to start in early March.

The re-nourishment will place approximately 2.5 million cubic yards of sand on critically eroded beaches within the city of St. Augustine Beach, extending three miles from Anastasia State Park at the north to the vicinity of A Street at the southern end of the shoreline.

Placement will proceed from north to south. Jacksonville District will post work schedules and progress maps to its website and social media channels as the work progresses - <u>https://www.saj.usace.army.mil/StAugustineBeach/</u>.

The \$33 million contract, awarded to Great Lakes Dredge and Dock Company, is 100 percent federally funded with Flood Control and Coastal Emergencies monies. The renourishment is projected to be complete by the end of June, weather permitting.

Initial construction of the 3-mile project was completed in January 2003. Since then the project has been renourished approximately every five years or following significant hurricane events. The Jacksonville District shares a strong partnership with St. Johns County, the non-federal sponsor for this project along with many others to protect eroded beaches along the county's coastline.

A Street West Parking Improvements Project



On January 29, 2024, construction began on the A Street Parking West Improvements project in the City of St. Augustine Beach.

The intent of the A Street Parking West Improvements project is to improve the safety, aesthetics, and drainage of the city owned parking area located on A1A Beach Blvd between A Street and 1st Street.

During the construction of this project, the public A Street Parking lot located on the west side of A1A Beach Blvd will be closed until further notice. Businesses immediately adjacent to the construction site will remain open during this time. The current construction activity will have little to no effect on the residents located on 1st Street, however, we urge residents to utilize 2nd Ave when leaving or returning to avoid any delays while construction materials and equipment are being brought into the project site.

Parking improvements to include:

+The installation of a new stormwater drainage retention system that will connect to the existing St. Johns County stormwater system.

+The Installation of new concrete and brick-paver parking area that will accommodate:

+Nine (9) standard parking spaces

- +One (1) ADA space
- +Two (2) motorcycle spaces

+Reworked entrance from 1st Street and a redesigned exit on County Road A1A Beach Blvd,

+Sidewalk and landscaping work.

The tentative schedule is below:

01/29: Erosion Control Measure Installation and Site Demolition.

02/05: Underground Drainage System Construction

03/01: Parking Lot Concrete Curb, Driving and ADA Parking Surfaces Installation

04/01: Paver Installation.

05/18: Substantial Completion.

06/01: Final Completion.

Funding for this project is by received from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA).

Glass Recycling Program



In partnership with the City of St. Augustine, a glass recycling program is in full swing in the City of St. Augustine Beach.

A glass ONLY recycling dumpster is located at the South end of the City Hall parking lot (between the old Post Office Building and the Police Department).

The program is expected to run indefinitely, and the City of St. Augustine Beach welcomes the opportunity to provide additional services for its residents.

Below is a break-down of acceptable and not acceptable items:

What glass IS acceptable? Packaging food, beverages, hot sauces, spices, syrups, baby foods, perfume bottles, cosmetic jars, mason jars.

Remove metal and plastic lids and caps. Remember to rinse.

What glass is NOT acceptable? Dishware, crystal and stemware, and all drinkware, figurines of glass, ceramic, and porcelain. Automotive windows, mirrors

picture frames, tabletops, mirrors, computer monitors, and screens of any type. Magnifying glass, eyewear, marbles, light bulbs.

Share Your Ideas & Take "Pride in our Plazas"

City of St. Augustine Beach visitors and residents may have noticed some recent improvements along A1A Beach Boulevard, including the new eco garden between 7th and 8th Streets. SEPAC has been working hard to beautify the City's public plazas/parks. Do you enjoy the plazas? Do you have ideas to beautify them? Do you have a favorite plaza that might be a good candidate for an environmentally friendly landscaping project? SEPAC would like to know!

The City has numerous plazas, and they serve several purposes. Of these,

about 20 spaces are reserved for the public to enjoy. Some have benches, some have signature teal signs, some have coquina rocks, and all have trees, plants and flowers native to Northeast Florida. These plazas increase the visual appeal of the City and enhance residents' quality of life, though many City residents may not be aware that these areas are actually parks that are meant for their leisure use.

"It's a unique feature of the City. I don't know of other cities in our area that have them," City Manager Max Royle says. "They are meant to be beautified areas along the public right of way. The Committee has been very keen on beautifying them and has done a good job. They are nicely landscaped, and they're really pleasant."

SEPAC, formerly the Beautification Advisory Committee/Tree Board, started in 1997. The group's original mission was to beautify A1A Beach Boulevard, and the Committee is known for helping organize the City's Arbor Day celebration. SEPAC continues to develop beautification projects, but has expanded to look at various environmental issues facing the City, inform and involve the public in discussions, and make recommendations to the City Commission. 
SEPAC Members Needed: Work on Important Projects!

American Flag Rescue Program

The American Flag Rescue (AFR) program was initiated in 2019 after St. Johns County Solid Waste Management staff observed worn and damaged Americans flags in drop-off garbage containers at the Tillman Ridge facility. Although some flag collection containers already were in place in several stores that sell American flags, more collection points were clearly needed. The initial shipment of new flag collection boxes was funded by local radio personality Kevin Geddings. These units were placed in St. Johns County libraries. Of the nearly 1,000 flags collected in 2020, about 10% were reusable and these are available to the public. Damaged flags are retired according to established protocols by local Scout troops and veteran's organizations. An American Flag booklet provided by Supervisor of Elections Vicky Oakes is also available.
